




Fig. 8.7. A beaver mandible from the Fens (E 140), dated to around 1400–1300 BC, now of the University Museum of Zoology, Cambridge. It has been neatly trimmed at the rear.



- Pelt (very dense and warm, also for waterproof hats)
- Meat (especially during lent)
 Teeth & claws for jewellery
 Castoreum (general remedy)



Use the meaty part of the beaver tail from the base forward to the beginning of the scaly part of the tail (about one third of the way from base to tip). The thickest part of the scaly portion of the tail can also be used once the scales are cleaned off. Do not remove the fat. For this recipe, the meat does not require preparatory soaking in water, salt and vinegar as described above. Divide the tail crosswise in smaller pieces, 3-4 cm long. 1.5-2 litres water

salt

pepper

a little thyme and sage and a

lovage leaf

150g celery

a medium large leek


2 large carrots


finely chopped parsley

2 cloves

2 bay leaves

Boil the meat with the salt, pepper and seasonings until it is quite tender. Add the vegetables and boil further until they are tender. The fat, which has not melted, has a jelly-like consistency and a very piquant taste.

An overview of a site scoping process for the assessment of potential European beaver release sites in Wales 2012/2013






