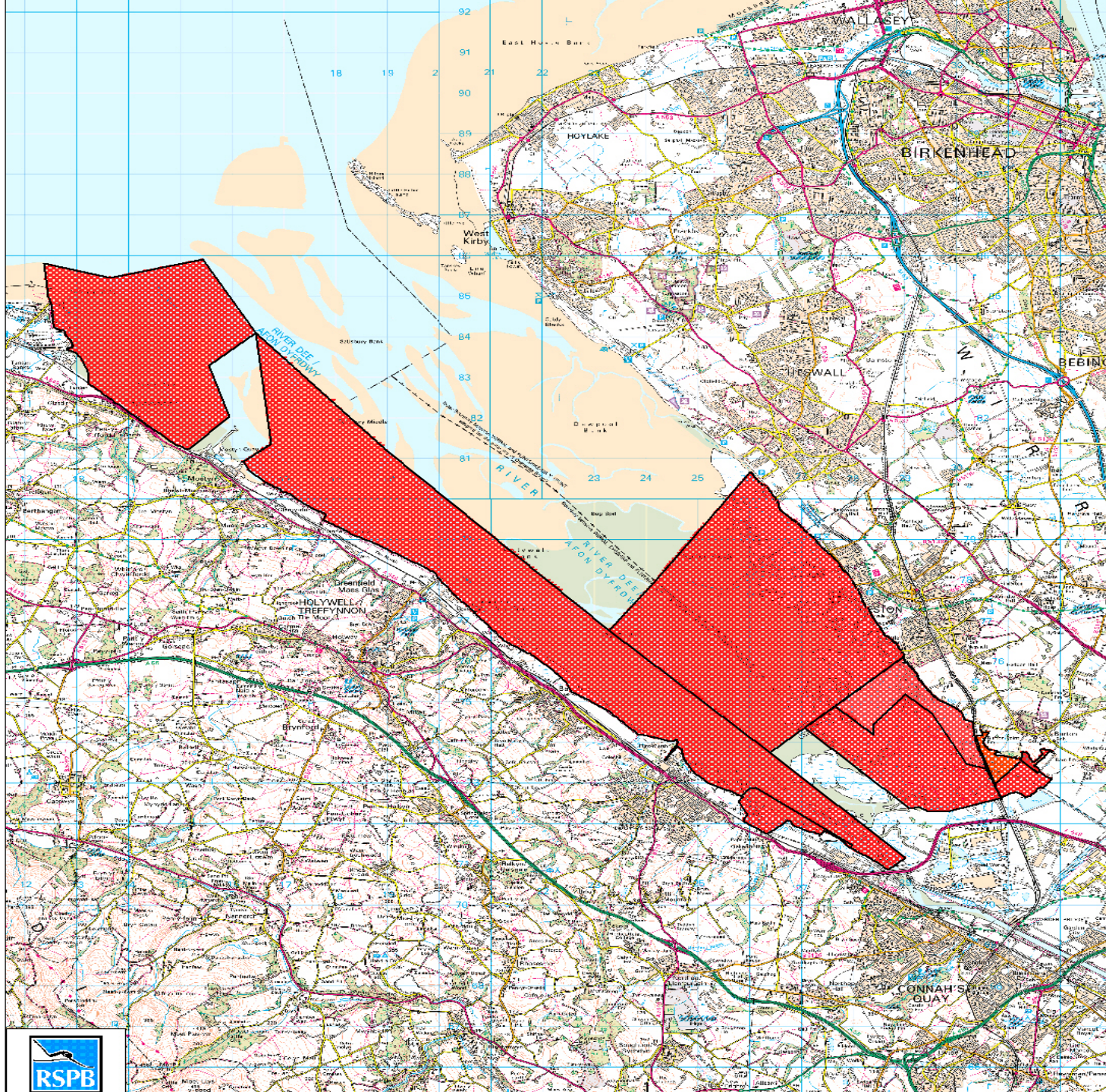

# Dee Estuary Importance

- **120,000** wetland birds winter each year – 7<sup>th</sup> most important estuary in UK
- Internationally important for **seven** species: **shelduck**, **pintail**, **oystercatcher**, **knot**, **dunlin**, **black-tailed godwit** and **redshank**.
- Nationally important for **13** more species including **curlew**, **ruff**, and **lapwing**.
- **UK**, **European** and **Worldwide** designations - **SSSI**, **SPA** and **Ramsar**.













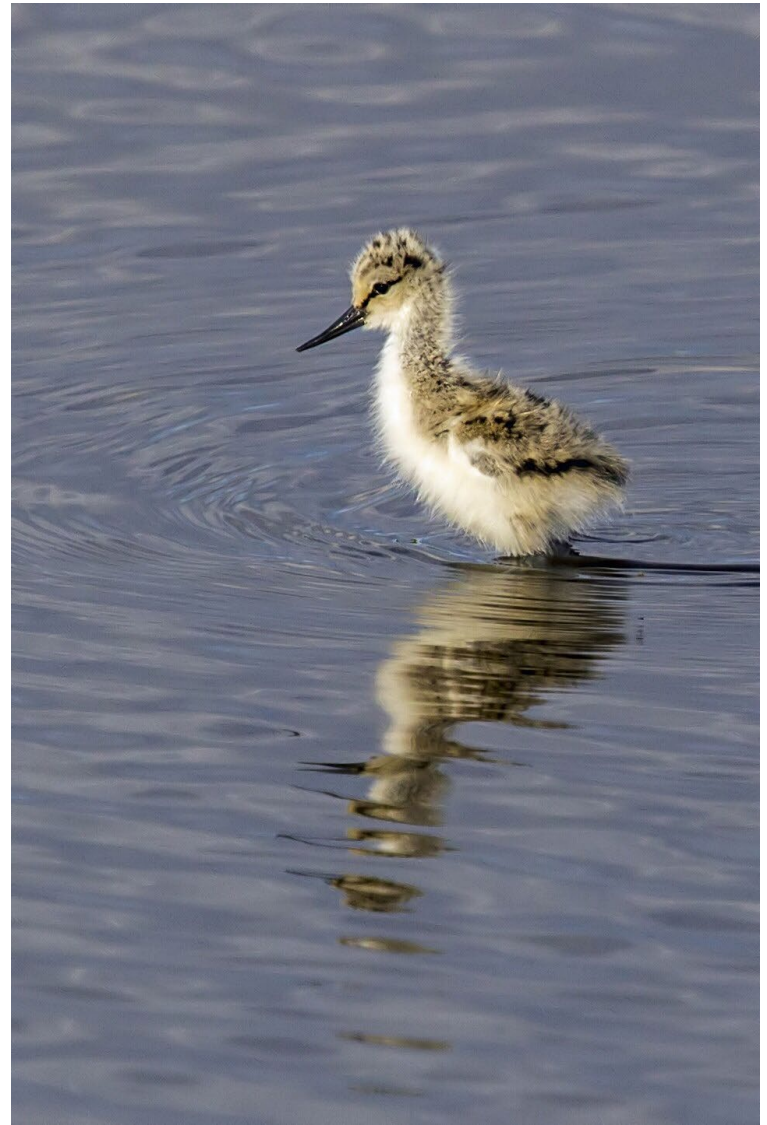




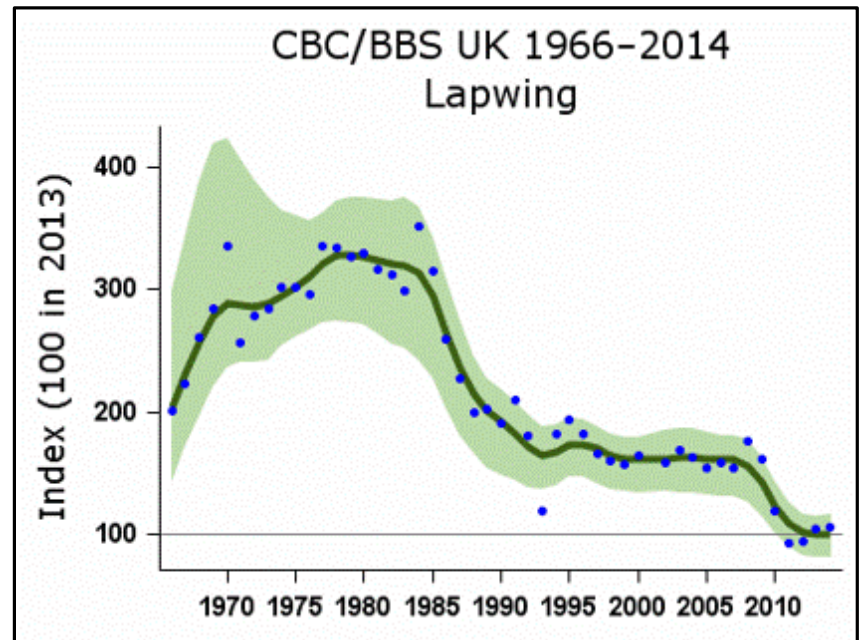
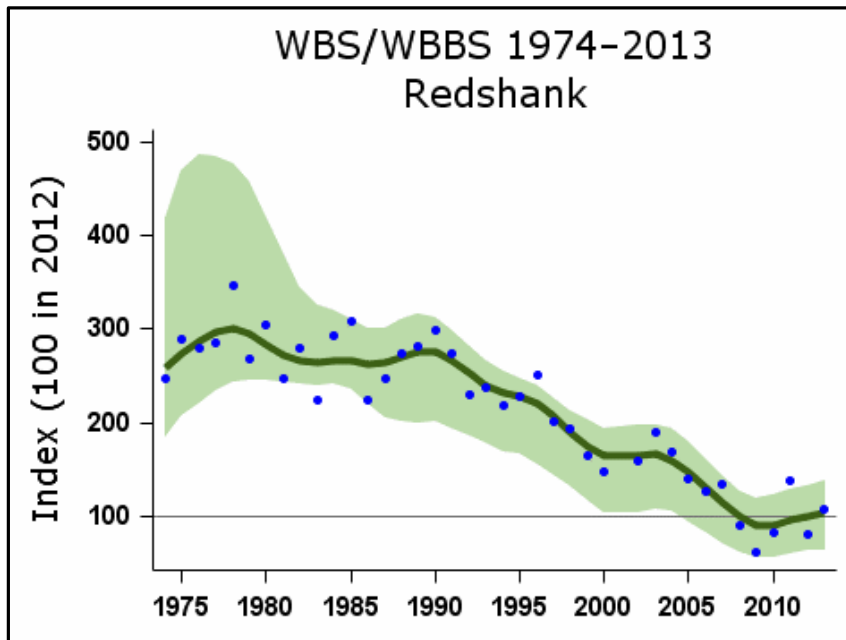






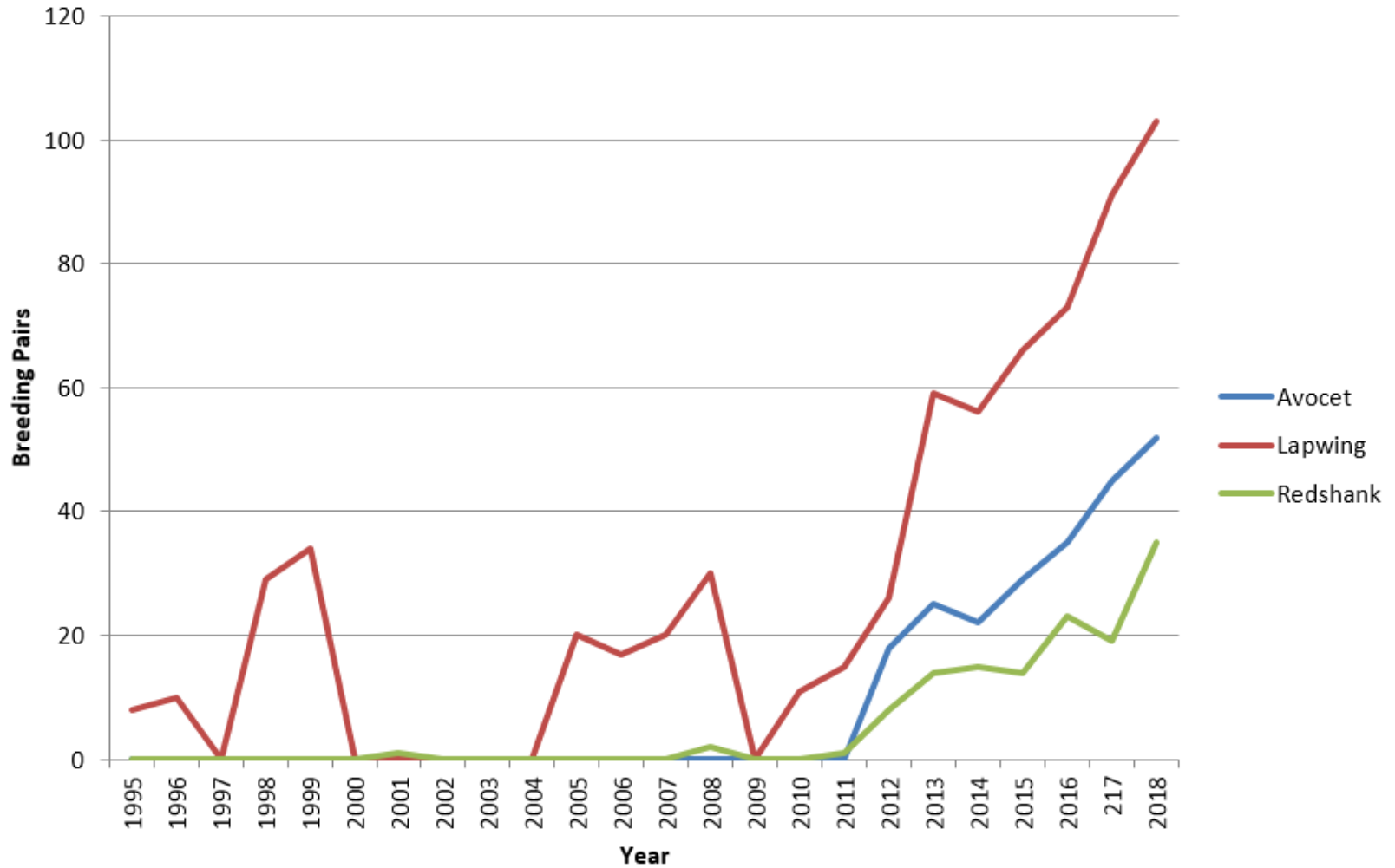






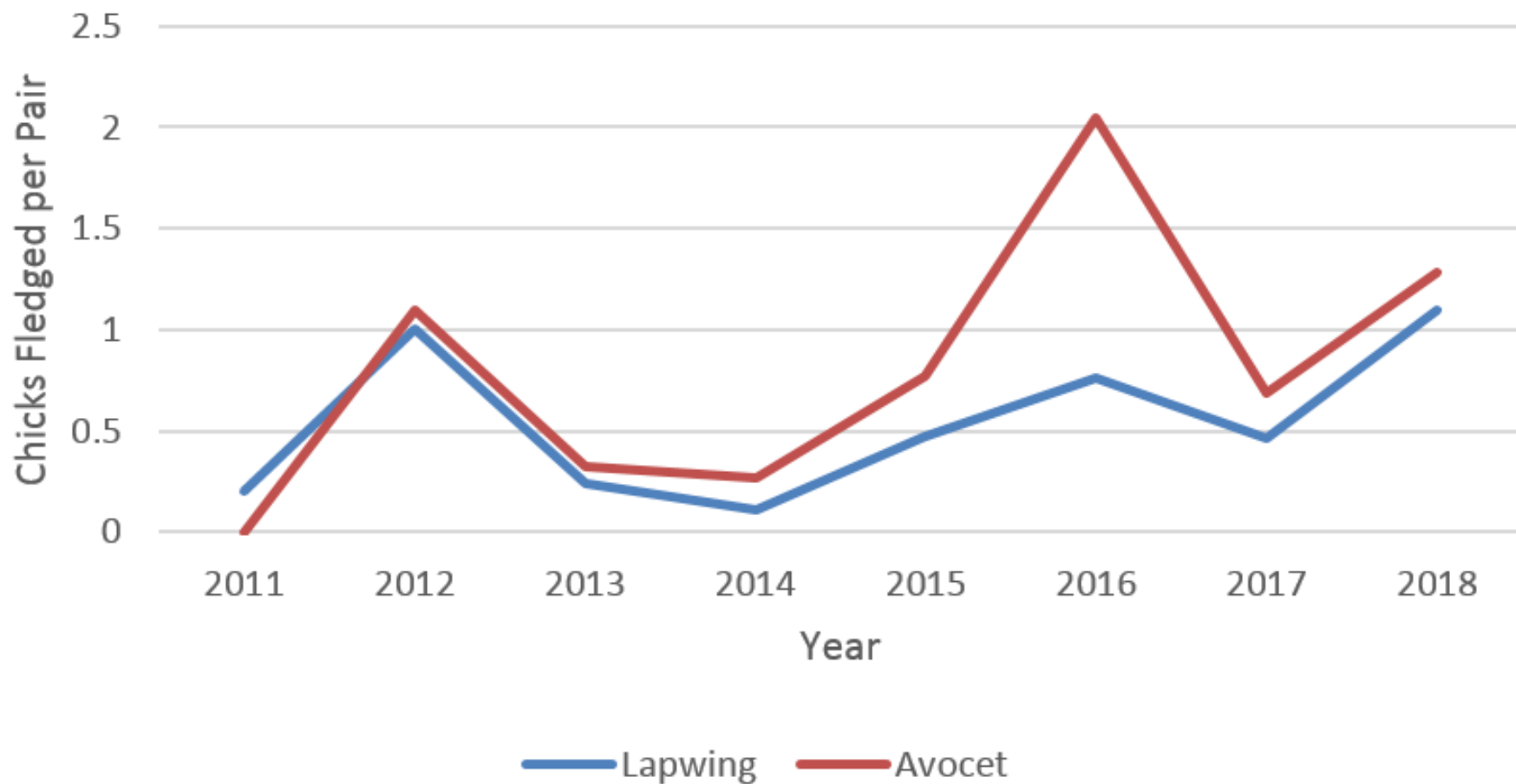
