# Our Planning system is changing...

**Draft NPF4** 

New-style Local Development Plans New statutory requirements, e.g.

 A vision for Scotland to 2045

- Draft Regulations
- Draft LocalDevelopmentPlanningGuidance
- Open Space Strategies
- Forestry and woodland strategies

#### What is NPF4?

- A long term plan setting out an approach to planning and development to help achieve a net zero, sustainable Scotland by 2045
- 5 parts:-
  - National Spatial Strategy
  - National Developments
  - National Planning Policy
  - Delivery section
  - Annexes

#### What's different?

- bringing together spatial and thematic planning policy for the first time
- part of the 'development plan' once adopted. This means NPF4 will have a stronger role in day-to-day planning decision making.
- 'New style' Local Development Plans no need to repeat national policies, helping to streamline the system and focus on place and delivery.
- Individual PAs can still bring forward local policies, if good reason to depart from national framework



#### What's different?

#### National Planning Policies: Key changes

#### Less:

- high emissions developments
- development in climate vulnerable areas
- impact on ecosystems
- out of town retail
- greenfield development
- housing development outwith planned areas
- car dependent development
- peat and fossil fuel extraction
- disused land and buildings

#### More:

- localism / mixed use
- town centre development
- quality and diverse homes
- blue green infrastructure, nature restoration, play
- flexibility for work and business
- renewable electricity and heat
- circular economy facilities
- public transport and active travel connectivity
- reuse of vacant and derelict land
- rural development

# **Summary: NPF4 and Biodiversity**

- Focus on enhancing connectivity nature networks across
   Scotland embedded throughout
- Promoting nature-based solutions to climate change, which also protect and restore biodiversity
- Climate change and nature recovery as primary guiding principles for all plans and decisions (universal policy 3)
- Focus on on-site enhancement, avoiding the use of complex metrics
- Continuing role for developer contributions where relevant statutory tests are met



# **Draft Universal Policy 3: Nature Crisis**

- Builds on, expands and strengthens current policies in NPF3 / SPP
- Informed by NatureScot's 2020 report and Biodiversity working group including PAs, industry, key agencies and NGOs.
- Supported by draft NatureScot guidance on appropriate measures to enhance biodiversity – also out to consultation

# **Draft Universal Policy 3: Nature Crisis**

- local development plans to facilitate biodiversity enhancement across the plan area
- Measures to enhance biodiversity should be designed-in to applications for local development from outset
- Larger scale applications / applications likely to have significant
  environmental effects only supported if proposal will
  conserve and enhance biodiversity. This means leaving
  biodiversity in a demonstrably better state than before.
- Certain exceptions apply, e.g householder development and aquaculture.



## **Opportunities**

- Shaping new style LDPs which
  - 'facilitate biodiversity enhancement, nature recovery and nature restoration across the development plan area' [draft NPF4: policy 3a)]
  - 'set out proposals and actions to protect, restore and enhance biodiversity' [draft LDP guidance: section 3]
  - set out the circumstances in which developer contributions for enhancing biodiversity may be required [draft LDP guidance: section 3]
  - identify priority enhancement measures from NatureScot guidance & any additional measures to be considered [draft LDP guidance: section 3]



## **Opportunities**

- Preparing Open Space Strategies which:-
  - identify green networks wholly or partially within their area, which the planning authority consider to be strategic, by reference to a map.
  - …identify how green networks….within their area may be enhanced.
