Project Report for 2021-22





1

Published our first <u>Carbon Reduction Plan</u> (CRP) in July 2021 which sets out our progress on achieving our target of net-zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2030, and further actions we will take to achieve the goal. This will be updated in April each year.

2

Created our own bespoke greenhouse gas calculator to track our emissions from our Scope 1, Scope 2 and Scope 3 emissions set out in the CRP

3

Joined as a signatory to **Pledge to Net Zero** which requires us to:

- a. Set and commit to deliver a greenhouse gas target in line with either a 1.5°C or well below 2°C climate change scenario covering buildings and trave as a minimum
- **b.** Publicly report greenhouse gas emissions and progress against this target each year.
- c. Publish one piece of research/thought-leadership each year on steps to delivering an economy in line with climate science and in support of net zero carbon. Alternatively, signatories may choose to provide mentoring and support for smaller signatory companies in setting targets, reporting and meeting the requirements of the pledge.

7

Moved to a smaller, more energy efficient office in Ampfield, Hampshire. The office has several 'green' features including solar panels for electricity supply electric vehicle charging points and does not have a gas supply.

8

Launched a new Member Pledge for 2022 which seeks to get 500 members signed up and committed to reducing their own operational impacts and becoming visible champions for change in society. We have offered eight example pledges and an option of creating their own, and collated useful resources to assist members in achieving their pledge. Those who have pledged are listed on our website.

9

Ran a survey of the membership in May asking what Continued Professional Development options members would like to see offered by CIEEM relating to climate emergency and biodiversity crisis. The two most selected topics were 'carbon capture and storage in different habitats' and 'the implementation of nature-based solutions and how to identify which services the will provide' (selected by 71% of respondents). Results were reported to our Training, Education and Careers Development Committee which they will consider in planning future Continued Professional Development offerings.

4

Signed up to the **Professional Bodies Climate Action Charter.**

5

Integrated Action 2030 and its purpose as a key theme of CIEEM's Strategic Plan 2021-24, and therefore a goal of every part of our work.

6

Began reviewing the sustainability of CIEEM events and developing a Sustainable Events Policy.

10

Published Action 2030 group member Penny Anderson's detailed review of carbon and ecosystems, identifying the contribution those especially in the UK can play in the race to capture more carbon from the atmosphere whilst at the same time addressing the biodiversity crisis and incorporating other ecosystem services. Presented the Action 2030 Award for 2020 to the Committee Climate Change (2020 Awards were held in January 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic) and the 2021 Action 2030 award to Dialogue Matters working with Grantham Institute, Oxford University and BEIS, for the Global Climate Change: Strengthening Understanding of the Economic Impacts of Climate Change

4

Met with representatives from the Climate Change Committee to present the findings from Penny's review paper and our views set out in the position statement on Habitat Creation and Restoration for Tackling the Climate Emergency. We discussed the need to expand advice to incorporate the full suite of high carbon habitats, and evidence gaps in these areas. CIEEM was invited to submit any useful information/evidence to them and be more involved with their specialist committees.

13

Members of our Action 2030 group and Ireland Policy Group jointly responded to a Northern Ireland Government consultation on the Northern Ireland Climate Bill.

14

Held an **online event jointly with IES** linking COP15 and COP26 through the lens of nature and Nature-based Solutions for adaptation to climate change.

15

Jointly hosted an online event with the BES Scotland Policy Group to explore COP15 and COP26, how they tie together and the plans for them. Action 2030 group member Tamsin Morris presented Scottish perspectives on climate change and biodiversity at the event.

16

Commenced production of guidance on the use of sustainable materials and alternative methods in ecology and environmental management. This work is led by a small working group of members including Christina Dow, Clare Pugh CEnv MCIEEM, Dan Thomas MCIEEM, Debbie Bartlett FCIEEM, Diane Corfe MCIEEM, Jean Hamilton MCIEEM, Mark Latham ACIEEM, Mike Oxford FCIEEM, Ria Monkton and Sophie Mairesse MCIEEM.

17

Published a **statement on the UN Biodiversity COP15 and Climate COP26 meetings** calling for transformative change and for the negotiations for the two events to happen in an integrated way to ensure agreements tackle both crises together.

18

Attended fringe events at COP26 and created a blog, COP26 Was Not the Success It Could Have Been, setting out the outcomes from the event and our thoughts.

Other Activities

Most other aspects of our work and interactions with members aim to address either the climate emergency, biodiversity crisis, or both but have not been reported here as they have not been developed specifically for Action 2030 or as part of the Action 2030 working group activities.

Events and Publications

Members regularly submit blogs and *In Practice* articles, or host webinars on relevant topics which add valuable contributions to the aims of the project.

Our CPD programme and Member Network committee events also cover a vast range of topics in ecology and environmental management, and wherever possible we are keen to link the Action 2030 project aims with these events.

Policy

In our policy work, we provide the Secretariat for the All-Party Parliamentary Group for Nature which provides a forum for engaging and inspiring parliamentarians and others with the natural world, the major threats that it faces today, and the positives that come from a healthy natural environment. Past events with the group have included discussions on COP15, COP26 and Nature-based Solutions to the climate emergency.

In the 2021-22 year, we held Two webinars following part 1 of COP15: **the first** focusing on the threats, conservation and restoration of biodiversity, as well as issues such as skills and capacity, targets and enforcement, and public engagement. **The second** focused on the resources and finances needed to deliver the new Global Biodiversity Framework, business engagement and government intervention.

Many of our consultation responses, position statements and briefings produced by our Policy Team and Policy Groups are relevant here and are available on our **Resource Hub**.

Next Steps for 2022-23

Our focus for the coming year is to continue providing information for members through our Autumn Conference on Delivering Nature Positive-Carbon Negative, webinars, briefings, training, and articles on how we, as a sector, can go further to address these joint crises.

We will be submitting our Science Based Target for annual emissions reductions through the Pledge to Net Zero and will be publishing the 2022 update to our Carbon Reduction Plan alongside this report.

We will continue to review our current practices and membership offerings, including conducting a review of our Competency Framework which will ensure it adequately addresses the climate emergency and biodiversity crisis. At all stages, we will ensure transparent communication of our actions.

We will continue collaborative working with other environmental bodies and key institutions, particularly through our membership of the Environmental Policy Forum, Pledge to Net Zero and Professional Bodies Climate Action Charter.

Finally, we will continue to encourage action from members through our member pledges and promoting a systems-thinking and collaborative approach to ecological interventions which support a wide range of ecosystem services. We urge our members to assess the impact of their organisations, mainstreaming sustainable practice and encourage suppliers and pension providers to make changes.



Meet the Action 2030 Working Group

The Action 2030 working group was launched in October 2019 to act as 'a sounding board, an ideas generator and a challenge body' to help us address the climate emergency and biodiversity crisis. This year, we continued meetings of the group (5 meetings in 2021/22) where we plan and deliver activities set out in this report. The group advise on Secretariat-led activities, and author or deliver many of the blogs, In Practice articles and webinars listed.


